Some months ago Marjorie had a fall, from which she has recovered, but it led her to the decision that they were no longer able or safe to live as they were, particularly with Nasief's increasing dementia and other health issues.

Marjorie and Nasief put their names down to move to a care home run by Methodist Homes for the Aged, near to where their son Michael lives. There was a waiting list and Marjorie expected a lengthy wait for a vacancy but received a call last week to say that accommodation had become available. Since then matters have moved forward very quickly. It is planned for Nasief to move there this Thursday 9th and Marjorie will herself move in permanently the following Tuesday 14th.

As they make this move please pray for them, that the move goes well and they settle quickly into their new surroundings.

FEAST DAY OF THE WEEK - TERESA OF AVILA

Teresa of Avila was born on 28th March 1515 and died on October 4th 1582 at the age of 67, and is remembered on 15th October.

Teresa was a Spanish nun, one of the significant women in the catholic church. She was a writer and a created the Carmelite way of life, with the emphasis on austerity and contemplation. Teresa was elevated to be a doctor of the church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI - the first woman to be given this honour. After a period of ill health, Teresa developed a love for prayer. Carmelites today still follow the principles of prayer community and service to others, and we have a group who follow the Carmelite teaching who meet in our hall

Quotes from Teresa of Avila include

"Let nothing perturb you, nothing frighten you. All things pass. God does not change. Patience achieves everything."

"Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours, Yours are the eyes through which to look out Christ's compassion to the world Yours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good;

Yours are the hands with which he is to bless men now."

"You pay God a compliment by asking great things of Him."
