HIDDEN IN PLAIN SIGHT

The observant of you will have noticed the chains hung around the church. Sunday 19th October marking the end of a week of national activism, raising awareness of modern slavery which is still taking place around the world and in this country. This is not a problem just happening elsewhere. Arrests have been made in locations within our town of Redditch! In 2024, 19,125 people were referred to the authorities in this country, but it is estimated that there are between 122,000 and 130,000 people in this country in modern slavery. A third are children. Globally, it could be 4 million slaves. We all need to be vigilant as we go about our daily lives,

FEAST DAY OF THE WEEK - ST LUKE THE EVANGELIST

Author of one of the Gospels and the Book of Acts, which tells of the life of the early church and the challenges it faced. Luke, a physician and gentile, was a companion of St Paul. Unsurprisingly, Luke is the patron saints of physicians, as well as artists. Little is known about Luke's personal life, but that is not unusual for a person living around this time, when information was passed on through storytelling rather than the written word. Luke's gospel is notable as it includes a lot of historical detail, and focuses on themes such as compassion for the poor and marginalised, the work of the Holy Spirit and the mission of the church as part of God's unfolding plan. It also includes accounts of healing - well he was a doctor! Women also feature prominently in Luke's gospel. showing them as having an important role in Jesus' ministry, which was totally counter to the culture of the time.
